
# PARENT TEACHER COMMITTEE


### **DD** A FAITH-FILLED ENVIRONMENT

# FAITH HIGHLIGHTS

At St. Theresa Catholic School, faith formation promotes a relationship with Christ and teaches all students how to live the Gospel through love and service to others. Scripture, doctrine, prayer, and Liturgy are related to children at their developmental levels, beginning with their own experiences. While Catholic faith is the cornerstone of our school, we welcome students of all faith traditions.

Through the lens of Catholic social teaching, we encourage our students to respect the diversity, dignity and beliefs of all in pursuit of knowledge and truth through critical thinking and constructive debate. This helps form strong principles, a moral center and a vibrant community that celebrates all achievements for the common good.



Students in grades PK-8 participated in 38 school masses. In addition, our faculty provided 1,200 hours of faith instruction to all students.

Monthly a student from each classroom received the Little Flower Award. This award is given to students chosen by their peers for embodying the qualities of our patron saint, St. Theresa.



Teachers grew in their faith through participation in four after school sessions on topics including Apologetics, Praying with Students, Sacraments of Initiation, The Mass, Social Justice and Current Events, and the Bible.



### DD EXCELLENCE IN DD EDUCATION

On STEM Day, the pre-k kids built parachutes, while the older grades built rockets and launched them. ### **EXCELLENCE HIGHLIGHTS**

St. Theresa Catholic School is fully accredited in the state of Iowa, and we challenge students to aim higher academically, spiritually and personally through faith-centered learning and a rigorous academic program aligned with state standards. Since 2011, St. Theresa Catholic School has offered an integrated STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) education that is recognized locally, nationally, and internationally. This STEM-centered learning caters to learners of all academic abilities by working collaborative using hands-on methods to solve real-world problems.



St. Theresa Catholic School and its students benefitted from 10 business partnerships for STEM learning. Some of these vital partners included Area 515 Makerspace, Iowa State University, the Governor's STEM Advisory Council, South Central Iowa STEM Hub,, Accumold, Zirous and Kemin Industries



On May 11, middle school science teacher Ronda McCarthy, participated in a ZERO-G flight in partnership with Carthage College. During the flight, she recreated student-informed experiments and brought her findings back to her students.



Every St. Theresa student has access to technology as an educational tool. We have a fully equipped STEM lab and are a 1:1 device school.



# **EXCELLENCE HIGHLIGHTS**

St. Theresa Catholic School participates in the Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP). ISASP is a standards-based assessment designed to inform schools and families on how students perform on the Iowa Core Academic Standards. Students performing at the proficient level demonstrate adequate competency in the knowledge, skills, and abilities that meet the requirements for their grade level associated with academic readiness for college and a career in the subject area.

# **EXCELLENCE HIGHLIGHTS**

St. Theresa Catholic School applies the use of a standards-based evaluation tool, FASTBridge, for grades K-5 to identify student goals for learning and provide individualized student support to ensure these goals are met. This screening and early identification of student needs increases the speed of intervention and supports a building-wide multi-tiered system of supports. These assessments help teachers better understand student progress and needs. Moreover, this additional layer of data allows teachers to focus on essential skills and better track student growth.

### 2022 FASTBridge Highlights:

- 87% of K-1 students are on track in early math skills.
- 24% of students in grades 2-5 are advanced in their math comprehension.
- 32% of students in grades 2-5 made aggressive growth in their math fact fluency.
- 35% of students in grades 2-5 are advanced in their reading comprehension.

\*Aggressive growth is defined as a score increase from fall to spring greater than 75 percent or more of their peers nationally. \*\*FASTBridge does not assign an "advanced" designation for grades K-1.

Students in grades 6-8 participate in the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment. This assessment measures achievement and growth in math, reading, and language usage, providing teachers with data to help inform instructional strategies and create an individualized learning experience for each student.

### 2022 MAP Highlights:

- 21% of students in grades 6-8 scored above the 80th percentile in Math.
- 28% of students in grades 6-8 scored above the 80th percentile in Reading.
- 27% of students in grades 6-8 scored above the 80th percentile in Language.
- Students in grade 6 grew 11 points overall in Math.
- Students in all grades 6 8 scored multiple points above the national average in reading and language.

## **COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS**

Members of our school community experience together what it means to live a life of prayer, personal responsibility and freedom reflective of Gospel values. Teachers open the world of knowledge and pursue the intellectual development of each child; and believe that each child is a unique creation of God, and thus requires individual attention.

We teach love, care and concern for others as a part of our curriculum. Values of respect, discipline, diligence and compassion are instilled in all students. In addition, students in all grades have the opportunity to participate in community service and mission projects.



Our school serves students and families from all faith backgrounds, ethnicities, races, and cultures. Student diversity was 26 percent in 2021-2022 and our student body represented 15 different cultures.



St. Theresa Catholic School devotes an entire week to social justice every year. During this week, students engage in activities and hear from guest speakers that help expose our students to the needs of others and the world around them. Through our service learning opportunities, St. Theresa students provided 3,600 hours of volunteerism in the community during the 2021-2022 school year.

# VALUE HIGHLIGHTS

Investing in your child's education at St. Theresa is about more than a numberit's about a teaching approach that focuses on your child's mind, body and soul. Outside of the classroom, we offered a variety of clubs, activities and athletic programs that promoted teamwork, responsibility, dedication and good sportsmanship. 92 percent of 2021-2022 eighth-grade graduates continued their Catholic education at Dowling Catholic High School.



St. Theresa Catholic School offered bus transportation to 50 students daily. Additionally, our buses transported students to field trips throughout the year to enhance learning.




# THE COST TO EDUCATE

TUITION AND COST TO EDUCATE


- Cost to Educate = \$9,088/student
