State testing season is upon us!

All students in grades 3-8 will be taking the Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP) for Reading, Math, and Language/Writing the week of March 31st. Students in grades 5 and 8 will also take the Science ISASP during that same week.

As much as possible, please have your student attend during testing time (approximately 8:30 - 10:30 AM).

Per the state testing policies, "Headphones or earbuds must be wired. Bluetooth headphones or earbuds are not allowed." Please make sure your child has headphones that can plug into the school-issued Chromebooks via an audio jack or USB.

Your child's individual (homeroom) teacher may reach out with details specific to his/her classroom.

Time to apply for CTO tuition grants! In the Diocese of Des Moines, Catholic Tuition Organization (CTO) tuition grants are applied first to tuition expenses. The primary qualification for families to receive tuition assistance is based on meeting income guidelines. Tuition Assistance Available!

The first qualification for families to receive tuition assistance is income. Compare your income with the "maximum income" for your family size as shown in the chart below. If your household income is LESS THAN the amount shown, you meet the 2025 financial eligibility requirement for the Catholic Tuition Organization (CTO) or funds available through the Diocesan Tuition Assistance (DTA) established with the Ignite Capital Campaign.
