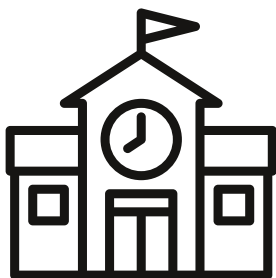

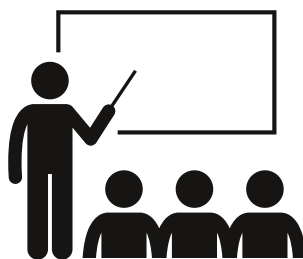

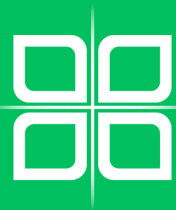

FAITH

Formation promotes a relationship with Christ demonstrating to students how to live the Gospel in love and service to others through scripture, doctrine, prayer, and Liturgy. Our Catholic faith is the cornerstone of our school, we welcome students of all faith traditions. Students in grades PK-8 participated in 39 school masses. In addition, our faculty provided over 1,200 hours of faith instruction to all students.

Scripture, doctrine, prayer, and Liturgy are related to children at their developmental levels, beginning with their own experiences. Prayer is interwoven throughout the student's day. Prayer begins and ends each day at our school, is experienced daily in religion class, and occurs before lunchtime. Additionally, students have the opportunity to celebrate Liturgy together once a week and are involved in the planning of school Masses. Family and friends are always welcome to these Masses to celebrate the faith with our school community.

Through the lens of Catholic social teaching, we encourage our students to respect the diversity, dignity and beliefs of all in pursuit of knowledge and truth through critical thinking and constructive debate. This helps form strong principles, a moral center, and a vibrant community that celebrates all achievements for the common good.





FAITH HIGHLIGHTS



22 second graders celebrated the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Eucharist.



During the 2024-2025 school year, the Little Flower Chapel in the school was used for multiple purposes. Students participated in saying rosaries and learning out our faith in a quiet, reverant place. During middle school masses Fr. Mike and Fr. Raphael said mass while teaching students about the parts of mass, church traditions, and active participation.



Monthly a student from each classroom received the Little Flower Award. This award is given to students embodying the qualities of our patron saint, St. Theresa and demonstrating the Habits of Leader in Me, showing that they are a true leader for Christ.



Teachers grew in their faith through participation in Convocation activities, Catholic Schools week Mass, faith journey sessions, and faith retreats throughout the year.

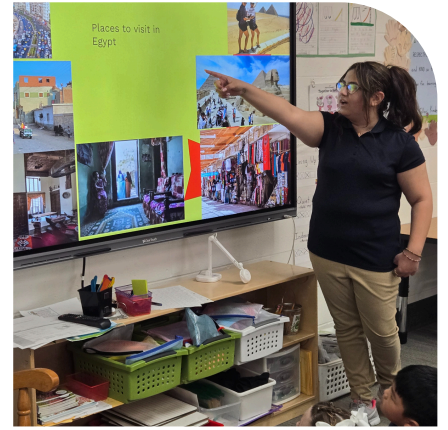


EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION

EXCELLENCE HIGHLIGHTS



St. Theresa Catholic School is fully accredited by the state of Iowa. We challenge students to achieve academically, spiritually and personally through faith-centered learning with a rigorous academic program aligned with state standards. Since 2011, St. Theresa Catholic School has offered STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) education in all elementary and middle school classrooms. This STEM-centered learning caters to learners of all academic abilities by working collaboratively using hands-on methods to solve real-world problems.



STEM allows students to be creative and use their knowledge in new and innovative ways that are unique to typical classroom settings. These opportunities allow students to master success in the classroom experiencing new way to express their knowledge.



STEM is taught in all grade levels by teachers in their math and science classes. We utilize multiple reading resources to promote STEM learning in our classrooms. Having STEM embedded in classroom instruction allows students to see how important math and science are in conjunction with inquiry and creativity.

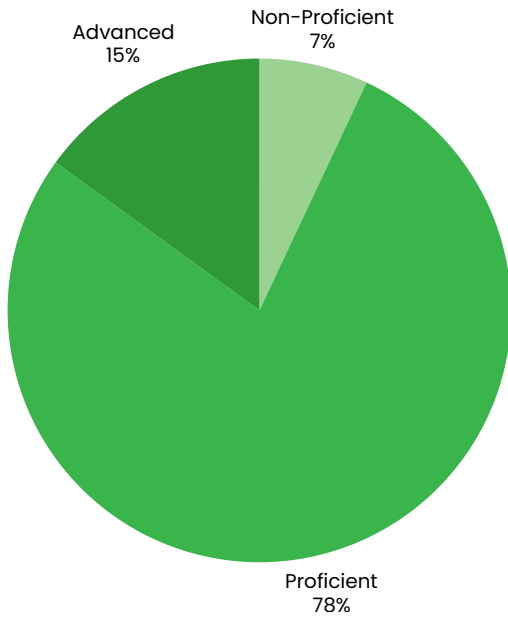


Every St. Theresa student has access to technology as an educational tool. We have a fully equipped STEM lab and are a 1:1 device school.

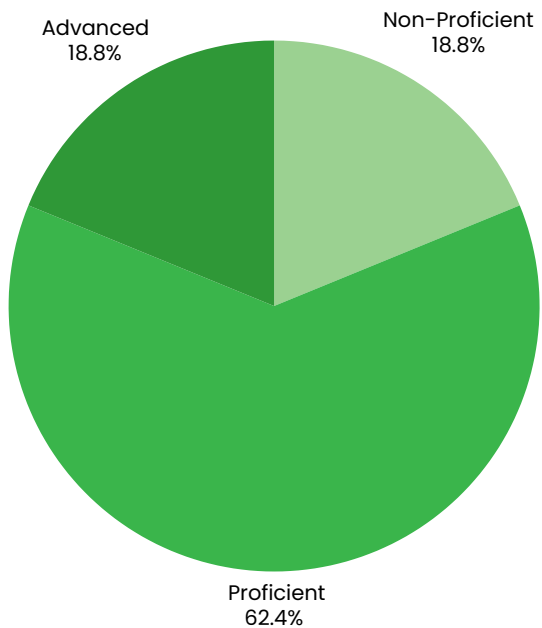


Academic Achievement

In the Spring of 2025, students in 3–8 grade participated in Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP). Students in grades 3, 4, 6 and 7 take Math and English Language Arts tests, while students in 5th and 8th grade took tests in Science, Math and English Language Arts. The graphic below shows how our 8th graders achieved on the test last spring. Our students leave St. Theresa prepared for their academic journey in high school and beyond.

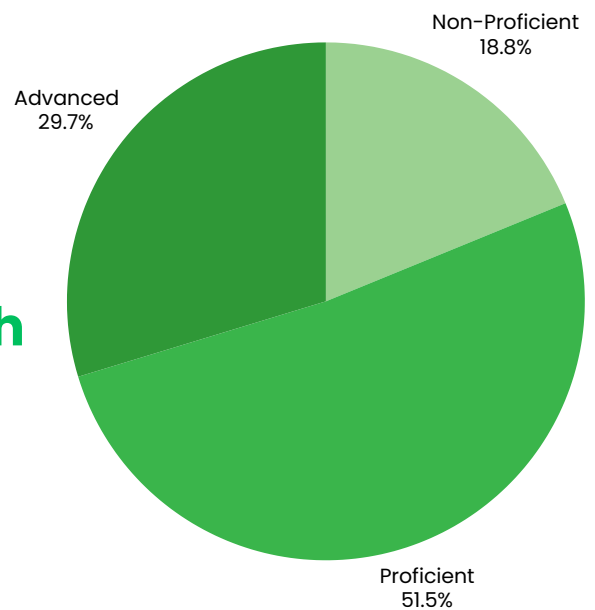


English Language Arts

COMMUNITY

St. Theresa School was created and continues to exist in order to partner with parents in educating their children. Collectively our school community experiences what it means to live a life of prayer, personal responsibility, and living the Gospel values. Teachers believe that each child is a unique creation of God, full of worth, dignity, and endless capabilities.

Our school has a rich tradition that binds our community and connects families, teachers, and staff on a deeper level. Each person in these relationships are personally invested in the success of our students and school.

We teach love, care, and concern for others as a part of our curriculum. Values of respect, discipline, dignity, and compassion are instilled in all students. In addition, students in all grades have the opportunity to participate in community service and mission projects. Through our service learning opportunities, St. Theresa Catholic students provide over 3000 hours of volunteerism in the community annually. Our staff also spends time volunteering in our community.





COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS



Our school serves students and families from all faith backgrounds, ethnicities, races, and cultures. Our student diversity was 29 percent and our student body represents 13 different home languages.



We served 272 students from nine different school districts across the Greater Des Moines region. We welcomed 38 new PK-8 students into our school community.



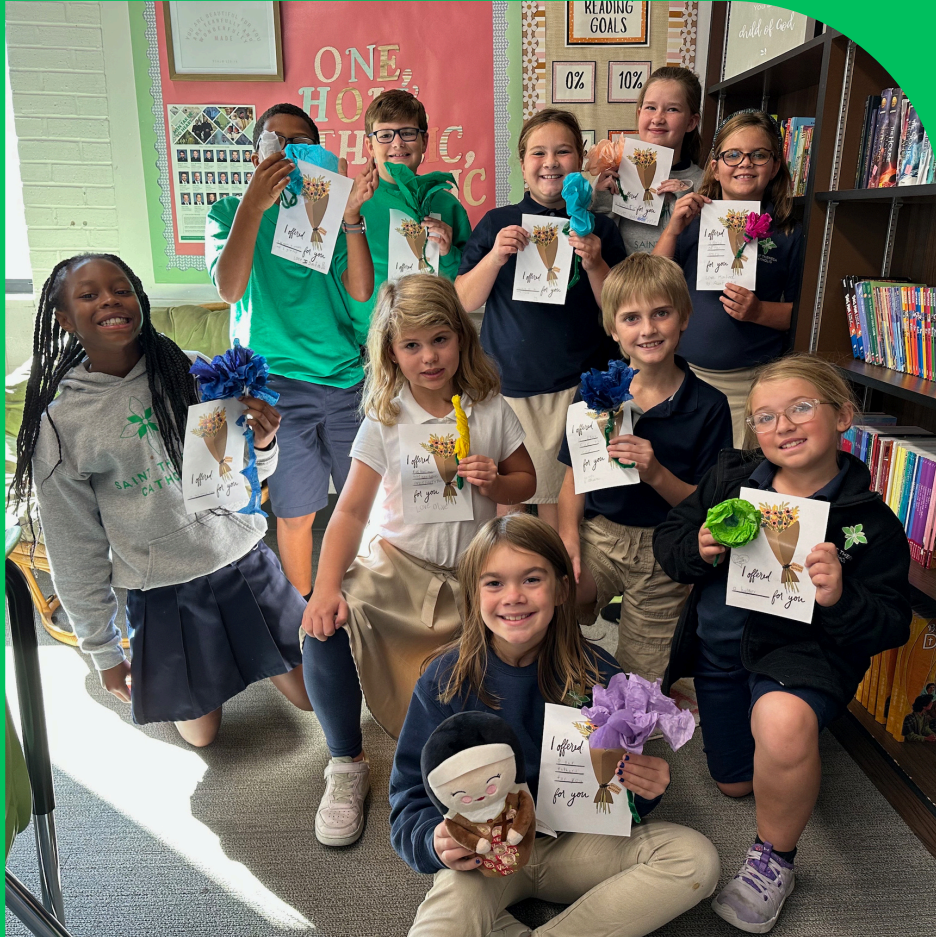
100% of our students and staff participated in service-learning by preparing lunches for the guests at Connection Cafe monthly, collecting much needed items for Catholic Charities, creating cards for homebound parishioners and for residents of the Calvin Community, and cleaning up the school grounds to beautify the space.



We added the Leader in Me Curriculum to our building, as well as continuing with Positive Behavior Intervention Supports (PBIS) and use of Restorative Practices. These provide students with positive reinforcement for meeting school-wide expectations and logical consequences for problem behavior. These supports provide students with the skills to be successful at soft skills used in life.

VALUE

Our students get to experience high levels of faith, academics, and service throughout their school day. Our teachers model caring, kindness, and giving to others on a daily basis. Our students have the opportunity to learn by seeing and doing. It is such a blessing to be able to provide the students these experiences for growth.

Our Spring 2025 raised money to invest in storage for classrooms. These updates will be coming in the 2025-2026 school year. We raised enough money to start with a few classrooms. This will allow better storage in our classrooms and make more space for students.

The Sister Jude Scholarship was developed to support students in participating in extracurricular activities related to St. Theresa Catholic Parish. Students and families can apply for the scholarship to support their students participation in band, St. Theresa Parish sports, and activities to help offset the cost for families in need so their student can participate.





VALUE HIGHLIGHTS



62% percent of our students received assistance from Educational Savings Accounts (ESA), the Catholic Tuition Organization (CTO) and Diocesan Tuition Assistance (DTA) totaling \$907,200 Making a Catholic education at ST. Theresa Catholic School possible.



St. Theresa Catholic School has a bus route that transports 26 students on daily transportation routes. Additionally, our buses transport students to field trips throughout the year to enhance learning.



In the fall we held a Parent Curriculum Resource Night, lead by teachers, to introduce parents to the new curriculums being used in the building. Parents had the opportunity to rotate classes to learn about Wit & Wisdom, Really Great Reading, Leader in Me, and I Love U Guys!



THE COST TO EDUCATE

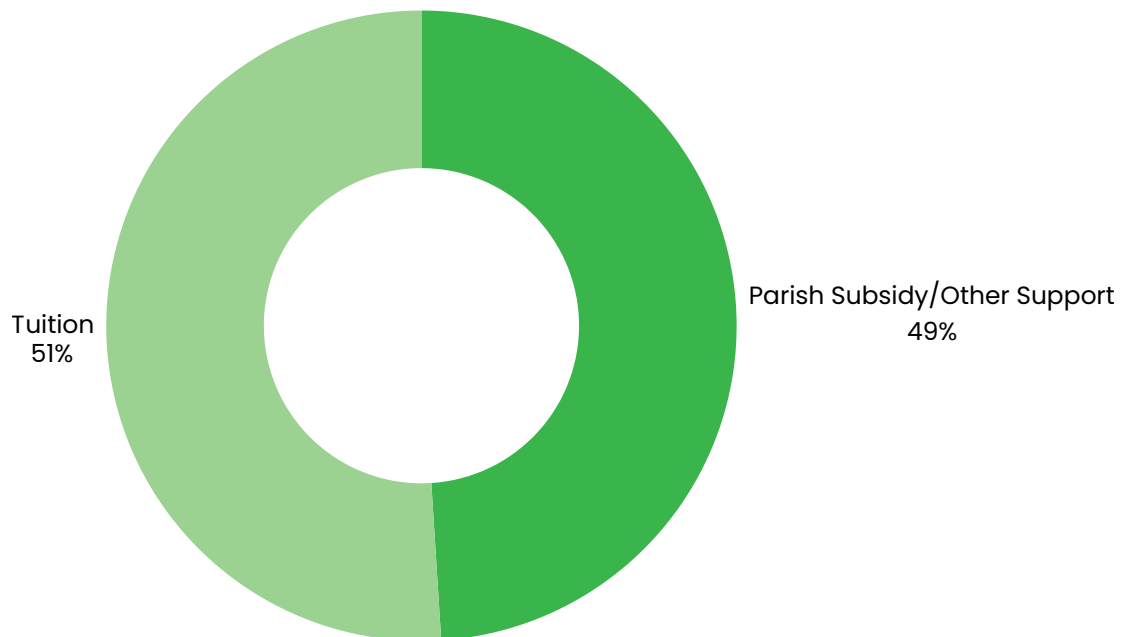
We greatly appreciate and understand the financial sacrifice our families make to provide their children with an education at our school. However, tuition only covers a portion of the cost to educate a student at our schools. The remaining amount is supported by parish subsidy, private donations, grants, and tuition assistance resources. We are incredibly grateful to the St. Theresa parishioners and all our supporters for making a Catholic education available to our students!

As parents, your tuition investment goes towards high-caliber educators, enhanced learning experiences, the latest technology, as well as moral and emotional education for your child. In addition, we offer tuition solutions and assistance programs — no family is turned away if they cannot pay full tuition.

In 2024-2025, 62 percent of our students received tuition assistance from Educational Savings Accounts, the Catholic Tuition Organization and Diocesan Tuition Assistance totaling \$907,200.

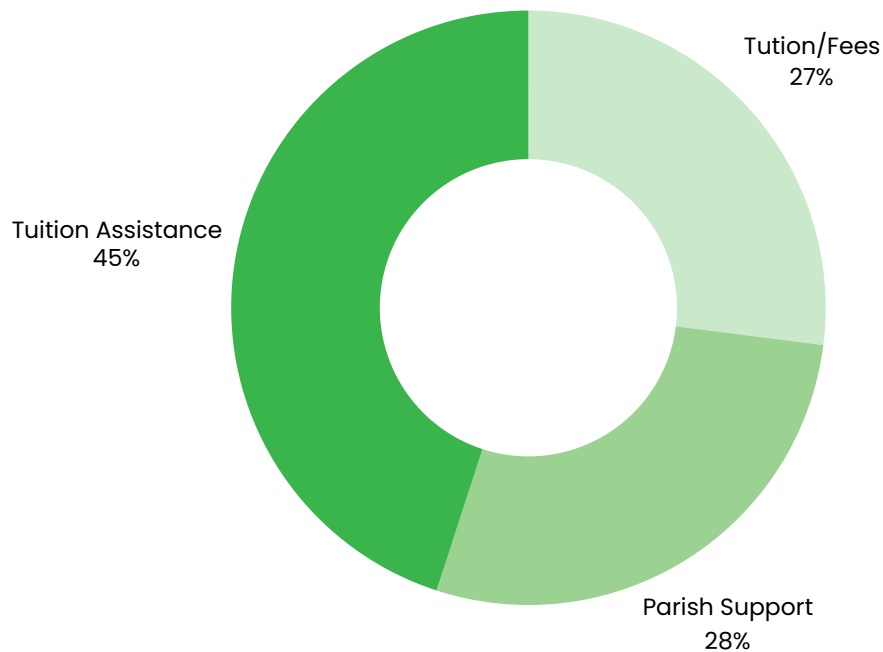

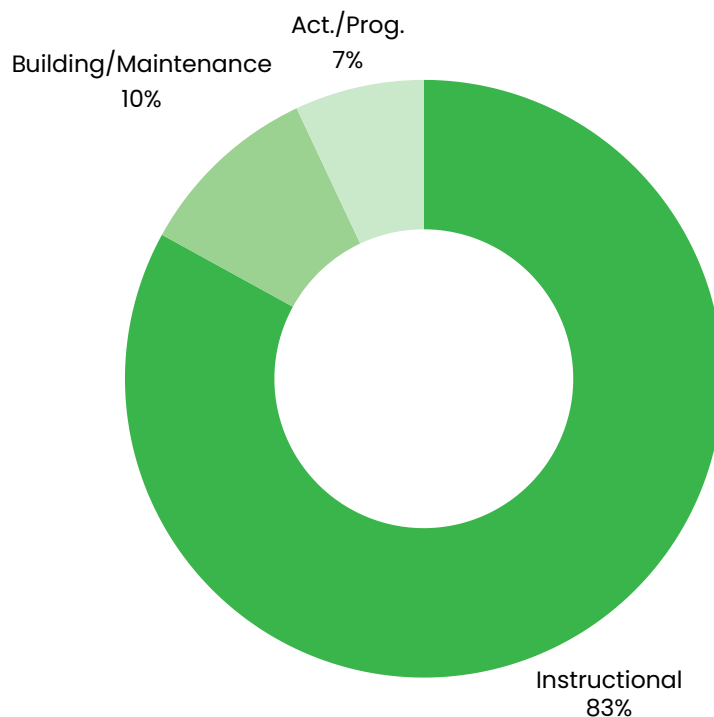
