<u>Wednesday Faith Formation (WFF)</u> Rich in scripture, symbolism and hands-on learning experiences, the Family Advent Night was well-received in November.

<u>Children's Liturgy of the Word</u> continues with 12-20+ children per session.

Altar Server Training Many students are very excited to become altar servers. Training will resume early in the year with the assistance of already trained servers.

I attended a follow-up session this month which focused on assessing and overcoming obstacles to this faith education process.

**Wednesday Faith Formation (WFF)** We gained 5 more students in the last month. Classes are running smoothly because of our terrific catechists and substitute teachers. We had 10 stations with scripture, an activity and discussion questions for parents & their children to encounter the meaning of Advent to prepare our hearts for Jesus.

# **Sacraments:**

<u>First Reconciliation</u> was held November 16 & 17 with a reception following.

Twenty-five students and one adult received the sacrament for the first time.

Several more will receive sacraments in the spring when they are baptized. Thank you to five area priests who assisted.

<u>First Eucharist</u> has been rescheduled for one Mass on Sunday, May 7<sup>th</sup> at 12:15pm. **P**arent consensus was reached and Fr. Raphael and I are on board with the update.

<u>Altar Server</u> training continues. Wed. night faith formation held sessions in October to train 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> graders. At least 5 new servers have already begun assisting at the altar.

I will attend a diocesan program on Feb. 16 regarding Eucharistic renewal & further discussion on ministering to families who have a loved one experiencing body dysphoria.

<u>Sacraments</u> A parent meeting was held on Jan. 25<sup>th</sup> regarding children's preparation for 1<sup>st</sup> Eucharist. Almost all parents were able to attend. Assist the Poor and Refugees

#### Parish activities involving people outside of our parish

Fall Cleanup project. This is actually an activity by and for parishioners but is not directly religious.

This year 45 households were helped by this project headed by Sergio Loch and aided by Tim Dempsey, Bob & Ed Downey. The people helped were very grateful but more could be helped if more volunteers were available.

St Theresa parish in Togo Africa. This project is about 20 years old and has grown over the years. We helped build a church and a school and now offer scholarships to students from preK to high school. At this point the failure rate for school kids is 60%. This is largely due to the kids often walking up to 5 miles to get to school and then have to walk home for lunch. Consequently, many don't return to school after lunch. Our parish has raised money to create a lunch facility where the school could provide lunch for everyone.

Sergio is also involved in two other programs outside our parish; 1 Alpha is a 10 week program focusing on deepening our faith and consists of a supper, a speaker and then small group discussion. He found it very worthwhile but it takes a great deal of personal resources. 2 Just Faith is a 12 week again focusing on deepening one's faith.

Sergio is also involved in RCIA. I'm sure RCIA will be covered by someone else in our group but he had an interesting observation. The group running the program but it's difficult to attract someone to commit o nine months. Also in his experience in Alpha he met several men who are former Catholics but had to leave the church after a divorce and a second marriage.

#### Social Concerns and Peace and Justice

In the 1980's the parish sponsored Vietnamese refugees and in the 1990's we sponsored African refugees. Many of those refugees are still in our parish.

Several years ago, Churches United started housing the homeless downtown in various churches and St Theresa parish has been a part of that. Over the years they found a building for the homeless and recently Bill Knapp donated land for a new building and now they have a great facility for the homeless. St Theresa feeds the homeless there on the 8<sup>th</sup> of every month. It started out with about 60 people and has grown to 225.

Emergency Catholic Charities House at 1535 11<sup>th</sup> houses 10 families. Jo Downey coordinates feeding those families on the 4<sup>th</sup> Friday of every month.

Str Theresa house is one the parish purchased several years ago to hose immigrants and others in need of temporary housing. Over the years managing the house became a lot of work so the parish worked with Anawim, a non-profit that manages properties around the metro and offers heavily subsidized rent to people in need. It's empty at this time and the parish in trying to decide what to do with it.

Fair trade products sales are another project of the social concerns committee. The objective is to insure the actual producers of the products get a fair price for their goods. Sales have becomed since Fr Raphael has become their salesman.
